DRIFTER GALS TIP OF THE MONTH

Drifter Gals - Those folks who were on the New Year's Rally and the Mesa Rally were treated to Cindy and Fred Brooks' Pico De Gallo Salsa - yum, yum, yum!!!! They have graciously shared their recipe with me so I can share it with you. Make and enjoy - - - -

**Pico De Gallo Salsa
(Mexico City Recipe)
(Serves 6 - 8)**

10 Roma Tomatoes (Firm)
3 Bunches Cilantro
30 Green Onions

2 Serrano Peppers
4 Limes
Sea Salt (or regular salt if desired)

Finely dice tomatoes. Removes cilantro leaves from stems and cut stems into 1/4 inch pieces and chop enough cilantro leaves to equal 1/4 cup. Slice all the white parts of the onions and half of the green stems. Dice Serrano peppers. Squeeze the juice from the limes. Gently combine ingredients and sprinkle with sea salt to taste. Refrigerate 2 - 3 hours before serving.

NOTES:

If the tomatoes have too much liquid drain off the excess.



Serrano peppers can be very hot so try adding one pepper at a time until the mixture is spicy enough for your tastes. To get the maximum amount of lime juice, be sure the limes are at room temperature and hand roll them before juicing. Salt flavor will dissipate as limes are marinating the mixture so there may be a need to add more salt.

Cindy and Fred originally brought the salsa to our happy hours but on the morning we had breakfast burritos it reappeared to put the already great burritos over the top!!!

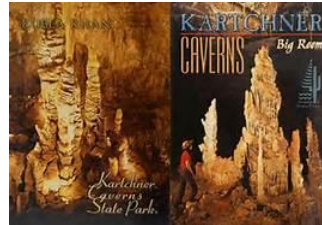

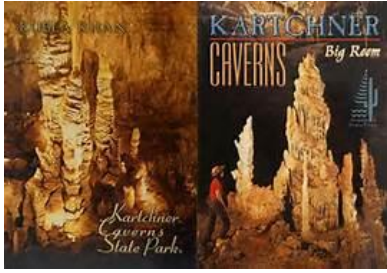

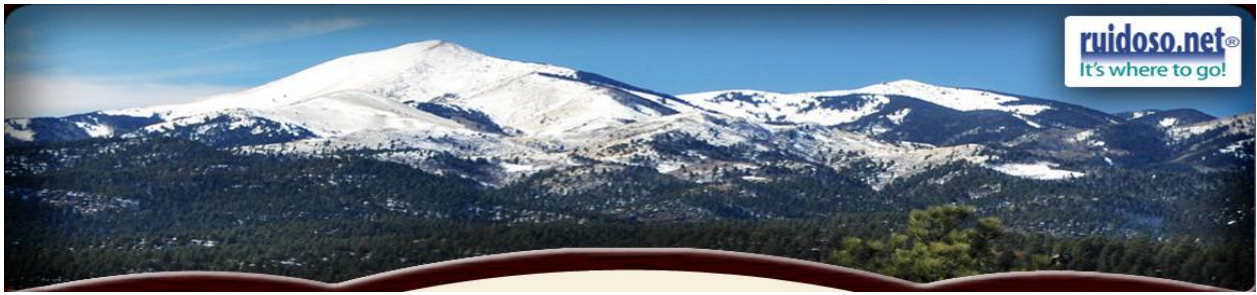
