Michelin Taylor's Update on Brad Taylor:



He's progressing well, he's starting to slowly get his strength back, starting to walk outside a little. The hard parts are all his restrictions, no driving for 4-6 weeks, no lifting more than 5 lbs. for 2 weeks, then 10 lbs. until after Thanksgiving then 25 lbs. until after

Christmas. No Christmas decorations this year. He's not allowed to raise his arms over his head or put behind him and he's not allowed to bed down. With his brain fog that happens after open heart surgery I must remind him not to do some of those things. He's breathing a little better his oxygen levels are slowly coming up - still has a way to go to open up those air sacs in the lower part of his lungs.

His pacemaker is working when needed and so far, he hasn't needed it since he came home. His heart rate is staying above the rate set on the pacemaker.

His new heart valve is working great, it's the latest model out there and he can't hear it when he sleeps. Everyone once in a great while when the house is very quiet, I can hear it.

His only 2 issues are some brain fog which I mentioned above and getting regulated on the blood thinner, Warfarin (Coumadin) This is expected. It takes about a month or so especially because his appetite hasn't come back yet. He can eat whatever he wants, just needs to watch the quantity/frequency of certain foods that would either make the blood thinner work harder or not enough. He had a nosebleed twice yesterday and his clotting levels were high which means his blood was too thin. So, no Coumadin last night or tonight. He needs his levels drawn twice a week.

It has been a long week and a half for both of us and we're both glad it's behind us and he's home.

Everyone was impressed how well he did post op in ICU and in the step-down unit. They said it was largely due to a lot of pre-op teaching. I had about 5 weeks to do teaching from using an Insentive spirometer, learning how to get in and out of bed, getting in and out of the car and telling Brad what to expect in ICU when he was waking up, the chest tubes he would have and all the other tubes. His only pain was the chest tubes, the right one hurt him from the moment he woke up and was taken off the vent and extubated. As soon as it was taken out, he had no more pain. He's only been taking Tylenol when he gets up and goes to bed for the chest muscle aches.



Kudos to Mayo Clinic. All I can say is WOW. The care is unbelievable, I can't say enough about the excellent care he received, and it wasn't because I'm a nurse and they knew I was a former critical care nurse, they treated everyone the same. We never heard anyone complain about staffing or any complaints at all. Everyone from the physicians to the nurses, admission staff, housekeepers, the person delivering the trays etc. etc. were friendly and gracious. Not one frown. The nurses help each other, they answer each other's call lights. If you want to build a utopia hospital Mayo is it. I wish I was younger; I would work there in a heartbeat.

As I was telling a few friends It's good to be home and have Brad home even with everything I must do being his private duty nurse, personal care giver, cook, dish washer, laundry washer, house cleaner, grocery shopper, dog walker, garbage taker outer, appointment scheduler and personal private driver for all his appointments 🕑 🍘

It is great to have him home \checkmark Brad is a good patient and listens to me most of the time \bigcirc

He said thank you for the get-well cards.

FRED'S TECH TIP



RV ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS

The following article was requested by Tucson Drifters member Joe Malisewski. His question to me was "why does an RV have 2 different kinds of electrical systems?

After considering his question, I thought this may be a good topic to give a basic understanding to those who have wondered the same thing.

The RV has a 12volt system and a 120volt AC system. Think of your RV as a car and a house. Your car has a battery that supplies all the energy you need to get you to your destination. It supplies energy that runs your engine, exterior & interior lighting, air conditioning & heating, entertainment & wifi and all safety systems. The battery is an expendable energy source so the engine mounted alternator keeps it charged up every time you use the vehicle. This battery type is called a "cranking battery" because it is designed to deliver short bursts of high energy to get the engine started. The life expectancy is 3 to 5 years typically and then it needs to be replaced.

The 120volt AC system in your house supplies you with all the energy you need to live comfortably. It supplies energy to run your house air conditioner & furnace, all kitchen appliances, interior & exterior lighting, all electrical receptacles that have anything plugged into them including entertainment, computers, and home security systems just to mention a few. When you lose 120volt AC power to your house during a storm or other failure, you become really aware of how dependent we are on that energy.

The following is all the energy sources that come with a typical modern RV. It has a "cranking battery" for the engine (if a motorhome), deep cycle batteries (known as house batteries) to supply 12volts for interior lighting, water pump, water heater, furnace, refrigerator and all the logic that controls the thermostats and other support systems. The house batteries will have a life expectancy of 3 to 5 years if properly maintained. The house batteries may also power an inverter if the RV has one. Note: an inverter is a device that can change 12volt battery power into 120volt AC power for use when in transit or dry camping. The RV may also have a generator. The generator supplies you with 120volt AC power to operate everything inside your RV that you would have at home.

The RV also comes with a shore power cord so you can "plug" the RV into 120volt AC power receptacle. The 120 volts AC also powers the converter (another word for battery charger) that keeps your house batteries charged and supplies all the 12volt power you need when in a campground. This configuration of 12volt power and 120volt AC power is unique in the sense that the RV can be used in a campground setting or it can be used in a "dry camping" (off the grid") setting.

Next month we will discuss simple methods of trouble-shooting issues with the aforementioned energy sources (not as difficult as one might imagine).
